Sutta Pitaka

- ▶ Digha Nikaya - Long discourses - *By Ven Ananda and students*
- ▶ Majjhima Nikaya - Middle discourses - *By Ven Sariputta and students*
- ▶ Samyutta Nikaya - Connected discourses - *By Ven Maha Kassapa and Students*
- ▶ Anguttara Nikaya - Numerical discourses - *By Ven Anuruddha and students*
- ▶ Khuddaka Nikaya - Small discourses - *By all monks who were at that time*

Sutta pitaka

- ▶ Digha nikaya (long suttas) - sutta 34 in 3 divisions
- ▶ Majjhima nikaya (middle length) - sutta 152 in 3 divisions
- ▶ Samyutta nikaya (connected) - sutta 7760 in 5 divisions
- ▶ Angutta nikaya (numerical) - sutta 9575 in 11 divisions
- ▶ Kuddhka nikaya (short) - 15 books

Abhidhamma pitaka

- ▶ Dhamma sangini prakarana
- ▶ Vibhanga prakarana
- ▶ Kathavatthu prakarana
- ▶ Dhatu katha prakarana
- ▶ Puggala paññatti prakarana
- ▶ Yamaka prakarana
- ▶ Patthana prakarana

In this division it describes about (*Citta*) Mind, (*Caitasika*) Thoughts (mental formations), (*Rupa*) Forms and (*Nibbana*) Enlightenment.

In Theravada Tipitaka there are 84,000 teachings itself.

Disciplinary rules (*Vinaya*) and Teachings (*Sutta pitaka*) contain 42,000 teachings.

Abhidhamma pitaka contains 42,000 teachings itself.
